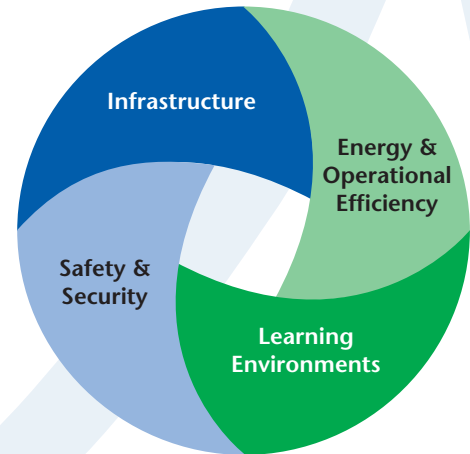

Bond 2016 Major Features



Bond 2016 is a comprehensive facilities upgrade and construction program that touches every building across the district. Key highlights:

- Learning Environment-focused upgrades to meet 21st century educational and technology requirements;
- Improvements to address the aging infrastructure of all buildings;
- Safety and Security upgrades that build upon security initiatives already in place;
- Energy initiatives to improve the operational efficiency of buildings and reduce operational expenses.

Extensive renovations will occur at all District buildings. Other features include:

- New Early Childhood Center located on the McKinley/ Crull campus, allowing consolidation of current programming. This provides additional space in our elementary buildings for expanded kindergarten classrooms, dedicated art and music space, etc.
- Replacement Elementary School for the current Kimball Elementary School.
- New additions at elementary and high schools and renovations at our middle schools to provide flexible and collaborative learning environments.

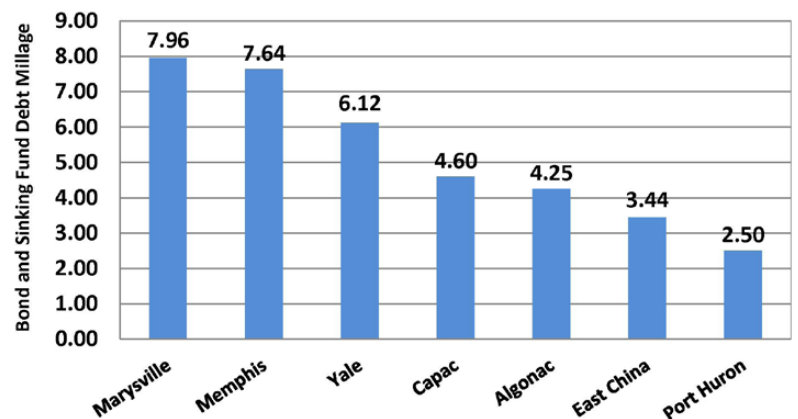
